How to write a nation's history in a global age? For two decades, calls have been made in the academia to „denationalize“ history and open larger perspectives. Global and transnational historians have highlighted the numerous connections, circulations, and exchanges that were long overlooked in classical national narratives. Still, nation-states, boundaries and sovereignty, haven't disappeared with globalization, on the contrary. Published in 2017, *Histoire mondiale de la France* (translated in english as *France in the World. A New Global History*, Other Press, 2019) brought together more than 120 historians to offer a new history of France, open to connections, wider spaces, and plural voices, without forgetting the many conflicts and power relations that have shaped the nation-building process. Building on previous endeavours to „transnationalize“ US, German and other national histories, this bestselling book triggered a vivid, and sometimes harsh, debate within French public sphere.
